Wellspring welcomes all new and returning families to our unique community of learners. As the school year is fast approaching, I would like to share some of our accomplishments along with Wellspring's strategic goals for 2018-2019. With the addition of several new leaders and teachers, Wellspring's faculty and staff are eager to begin the school year with enthusiasm and passion. As the school continues to grow and develop, our new initiatives and department goals for continued improvement and academic rigor coincide with the need to be competitive with standardized testing and global expectations.

Wellspring congratulates both the Class of 2018 and the 2018 Brevet class for their hard work and success. Our student success stories are really the stories of our learning community. Wellspring will remain an environment that empowers students to work hard, raise their own expectations and aim for success. The word "community" means that everyone including parents, teachers and students commit to their share of the learning responsibility.

Class of 2018

Although the class of only 9 students was the school's smallest in its 12-year history, it certainly made Wellspring proud of their efforts and IB accomplishments. Out of the 7 students who registered as Full Diploma students, 5 were awarded, 1 student will sit for a retake and 1 student chose to enter university at the Freshman level. Wellspring students continue to have 100% matriculation into the universities of their choice.

Brevet Results for 2018

Sincere congratulations go out to our 10 Grade 9 Brevet students for the 6th year of 100% pass rate. Special recognition was earned with 5 "Bien" and 2 "Tres Bien" marks and performance.

Personal Project Results-Grade 10 MYP

IB Official Personal project results were released on August 1st. Wellspring is very proud to announce that all of our students passed their Personal Projects. Average Wellspring grade is 4.77 which is significantly higher than the Average grade world-wide of 3.76 out of 7.

- 100% of our students completed the IB requirements for Personal Project.
- 71.4 % of our students got 5 and above
- 5.7% of our students got 6 out of 7
- 10 out of 35 achieved 4 out of 7 (28.5%)
- 23 out of 35 achieved 5 out of 7(65.7%)
- 2 out of 35 achieved 6 out of 7 (5.7%)

International DELF Testing at the French Cultural Centre

Congratulations to our students who sat for the DELF Junior exam this past May. Wellspring is proud of the 99% pass rate. We believe this international recognition of French proficiency helps our students to build their accomplishments on the path to French proficiency. Based on the same international standards used in 164 countries (CEFR), each certificate of accomplishment is an official document recognized worldwide that is an addition to each student's school language portfolio.

Congratulations to Tarek Solemay Grade 10

Wellspring congratulates Tarek for being chosen from Lebanon to complete his 2 year DP studies at the United World College in Costa Rica. Tarek joined Wellspring 3 years ago and we wish him the best of luck in his new learning adventure. Exciting Authorization News for Monitoring and Evaluation

Wellspring is now qualified to administer the PSAT/NMSQT during the next school year as a result of our recent CIS Accreditation status. For all students, regardless of their nationality, PSAT is essential for them to begin their SAT preparation for university. PSAT provides practice in a strict testing environment in order to become more familiar with standardized testing. Their results can be used to start more targeted SAT practice preparation for when they take their official exams in the spring of grade 11.

- The PSAT/NMSQT or the Preliminary SAT is co-sponsored by the College Board and National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC). It is a standardized test targeting grades 10 and 11 students. Essentially, it's an SAT practice test, which mirrors the SAT in regards to content, structure and scoring. Taking this exam is a critical piece in supporting students SAT preparation for university. PSAT testing will begin in October for Grades 10 and 11.
- By taking this exam, Grade 11 students with US Citizenship are also eligible to qualify for the very prestigious National Merit Scholarship.

Governing Board

Wellspring is now guided by a governing board and a set of school wide "Key Results Indicators" (KRIs) that will guide the board's continued vision and strategic direction of the school. Along with KRIs there will be a set of clearly defined policies to ensure that the school's performance and our students' achievements match the vision, values and expectations.

Understanding and establishing "good" governance is an ongoing process where school policies are born and implemented. Each policy has been well thought out,

thoroughly discussed and reviewed in specific committees before final approval and the introduction to the greater school community. Along with each board policy, the school creates procedures to support the transparent implementation.

Governing Board Training

Since the governing board is a relatively new entity for Wellspring's leadership, Mr. Richard Detwiler, who is a well-known authority and instructional leader for the development of governing boards, led a two-day workshop on June 9 and 10th for Wellspring's governing board membership, advisory members and the head of school.

It was an educational and enriching learning opportunity. During the sessions with Mr. Detwiler, board members worked on several school goals that are strategic in nature yet were implemented immediately for the continued vision and mission of the school. A third session was given to senior leaders, programme coordinators and subject leaders outlining everyone's responsibility to the Wellspring Board.

The Wellspring Parent Advisory Committee Report

WPAC shared their end of year report which high-lighted many positive school accomplishments along with opportunities and areas of growth for the coming 2018-2019 academic year. As Wellspring continues to build upon student success and academic achievement, the school is adding new senior leaders who along with our existing team of dedicated Wellspring members, will help facilitate the new strategic goals for the coming year.

Wellspring School Wide Goals for 2018-2019

- Academic Improvement from Nursery through Grade 10
 Document and review horizontal and vertical alignment in each subject and each grade level, academic deliverables and learning expectations in Math, English, French, Spanish, Music and ICT.
- Test with WIDA and establish individual language profiles for each student in PYP and MYP for tracking improvement and areas needed for increased development.
- Focus on reading and writing in English and Arabic-Nursery->Grades 6
 Exciting News-Lucy Calkins Writing Program 2018-2019

 Professional Training Workshop September 3, 4, 5, 6 Mathaf campus.

This year Wellspring will focus on improving students' writing skills by the implementation of **Lucy Calkins** writing and coaching program developed at Teacher's College (Columbia University NY). This method of instruction is based upon four principles: students will write about their own lives, they will use a consistent <u>writing process</u>, where students will work in authentic ways, and they will develop independence as writers. https://readingandwritingproject.org/about

- Overall updating of the Arabic language curriculum content
 Wellspring's Arabic subject leaders and IB programme coordinators with the support from local experts are using Lebanon's "Committee of Educational Research and Development (CERD") guidelines and learning outcomes to update the school's Arabic language deliverables, required language skills, the expectations of Wellspring's Modern Standard Arabic (MSA) program ensuring student success in official exams. The goal of updating our MSA program extends horizontally and vertically from elementary until Brevet.
- Embed more experiential learning, relevant field trips, inquire where and when the experience will enhance learning. Institute pre/post student discussions relating to each field trip experience by using an established protocol. On school starts in September, Wellspring will be requesting from each family to sign a "General Field Trip Permission" slip that will cover all field trips and walking excursions during the school year. Parents will be informed about upcoming trips but no longer asked to sign. Biweekly Wellspring electronic newsletters will continue this year.

Improve SAT scores

Our plan is to start with PSAT in Grades 10 and 11 this year and then roll it out to Grade 8 and 9 in 2019-2020 so it becomes a regular test every year from Grade 8 onwards. The school will track scores and target action on the areas needing improvement. PSAT is a good indicator of possible SAT scores.

 Review and update the school behavior policy
 Positive Behavior Intervention Program (PBIS) embedded into the 2018-2019 school wide Student Handbook and implemented into the daily classroom routine-PBIS school committee set up to implement.

Homework Policy is currently being reviewed school wide for expectations, content and student/parent follow up.

Promotion Policy is under review by the board and will be formally introduced by the end of September 2018.

Assessment Policy will have an additional policy joined to support student success and achievement. "Monitoring and Evaluation" where the expectations, numbers and types of assessments will be outlined for each programme.

Two New Policies introduced by Wellspring's Governing Board for 2018-2019

• Parent Concerns and Communication Policy

The creation and rationale behind the "Parent Concerns and Communication" policy (formally introduced to all stakeholders by the end of September), is the belief that improvement comes from the systematic collection, review and use of real data. Wellspring will institute a new "call in phone" menu to better track and monitor all requests, concerns and inquires.

Once the system is in place, Wellspring will announce the change. We value everyone's support in implementing this new policy.

Monitoring and Evaluation Policy

The constant monitoring of student achievement is a cornerstone to everyone's success at Wellspring. Because our students must compete in a global environment where standardized testing is an expectation rather than an option for academic success, Wellspring students will be monitored even more closely as this new policy becomes part of building on individual strengths and areas for individual student improvement. With this new policy, a systematic calendar across all grade levels in PYP, MYP and Brevet schedules where more opportunities and school expectations of reporting and the documentation of informal and formal assessments will be implemented.

School News

Exciting new play spaces for elementary students

An additional 257 sq. meters on the Mathaf roof top play space is currently under construction. The school has finally received permission to add reinforced steel posts and fencing to the roof of the Mathaf campus building. Once completed, the areas will be very safe and shaded for student enjoyment. The project is scheduled to be finished by the end of September.

Time changes for student arrival and dismissal for 2018-2019

- Mathaf accepts students beginning at 7:15 am
- City Centre Campus accepts students beginning at 7am
- Nursery-Grade 12 students are considered late at 7:41 am
- All Nursery-Grade 12 students begin learning and classroom work at 7:30 am

School Rationale for Time Changes

A Wellspring decision has been made for the 2018-2019 school year to dismiss all students a bit earlier (except on Wednesdays) at each campus.

The reasons behind the decision:

- shorter bus riding time in the afternoons-due to a little less traffic to navigate the streets
- a little less traffic for parent/driver picks to navigate
- more free time for after school activities/homework/play and family
- more efficient planning of school daily timetables-quantity/quality of education and break times are not jeopardized in the plan
- current early morning bus arrivals for students not being productive-just waiting
- parent requests
- shorter afternoons for teachers to end the school day

Wellspring believes that the slightly modified dismissal schedule will bring a little more balance into the lives of your children.

Significant Change for KG2 Students

- KG2-school day extended to 2:30pm (except Wed. early dismissal)-more time for inquiry, activities, learning
- KG1/ Nursery end every day at 12:55pm for bus riders (except Wed early dismissal)
- KG1/Nursery parent pick up/driver pick up begin at 1:15 pm (except Wed early dismissal)
- Nursery to Grade 4 will be dismissed together at 1:30pm during Early Wednesday dismissal.
